**The Belbin Model** is a business and management approach to understanding and optimizing the dynamics of work teams. It was developed by British psychologist Meredith Belbin in the 1970s. **The model focuses on identifying the roles and professional profiles** that are common in teams and how each team member contributes different skills and behaviors. Belbin identified nine distinct roles or professional profiles in work teams and suggested that each team member tends to perform one or more of these roles with greater ease.



# Teamwork step by step (1)

## > Coordinator

This person assumes responsibility for organizing and leading the team, ensuring that objectives are met and cohesion is maintained.

## > Idea Creator

They are creative and provide thoughtful, innovative solutions.

## > Specialist

They bring a high level of technical expertise or knowledge in a specific area. They are usually experts in a particular field.

## > Resource Investigator

They focus on building external connections and securing resources for the team. They are typically excellent communicators and extroverts.

## > Finisher

Critically reviews the team's ideas and plans, ensuring they are completed accurately and efficiently.

## > Implementer

They are responsible for turning ideas into concrete actions. They are practical and results-oriented people.

## > Equipment Evaluator

They strive to maintain harmony and teamwork. They are collaborative and resolve conflicts effectively.

## > Driver

They are action-oriented and seek to challenge the team to achieve their goals. They are energetic.

## > Collaborator

They focus on details ensuring that all tasks are completed on time and without errors.
